



SECTION 1: CSCE Student Chapter Goals & Objectives

Summary statement:

The main purpose of The Club is to represent, serve, and support the students enrolled in Civil Engineering at the University of Saskatchewan. Through affiliation with the Canadian Society for Civil Engineers, The Club will facilitate communication between Civil Engineering students and the professional Civil Engineering Community. The Club will work with the faculty and staff of the Civil and Geological Engineering Department to support the academic needs of the students in Civil Engineering.

Assessment of Goal #1:

Members were provided the opportunity to interact with the professional community at least once a month mostly through partnership with of our local section and their monthly noon hour seminars. In January the annual Popsicle stick bridge competition was held with 5 student team and 4 professional teams in attendance. This continued throughout the end of the term with our grad having the opportunity to hear from industry speakers at the banquet ceremony on the 19th of March.

Follow-up Plan for Goal #1:

This goal will continue be a central issue going forward and both the incoming and outgoing Presidents share an interest in maintaining these important relationships. Additionally the addition of the Vice-president External Affairs role places a specific member in charge of further enhancing our industry relationships.

Provide the opportunity for learning engineers to see firsthand the work of Civil Engineers in the community

Action Plan:

Coordinate several industry field trips to examine the real world impact of civil engineers through site tours and company engagement.

- 1 industry trip per term
- 1 major trip per year

Assessment of Goal #2:

Term 1 industry tour was completed in November, details of which can be found in the following sections. Work needs to be done to complete the major trip and second industry trip for the second term.

The second term trip was unable to be complete due to a combination of hosting Spectrum and the resignation of two executive members. The loss of these positions and the effort that went into putting on one of North America's largest student run STEM exhibitions lead to the goal of a second term industry tour being unfulfilled.

Follow-up Plan for Goal #2:

The incoming president also shares an interest in getting students exposed to industry and plans will be made to ensure our students have these opportunities available for years to come.

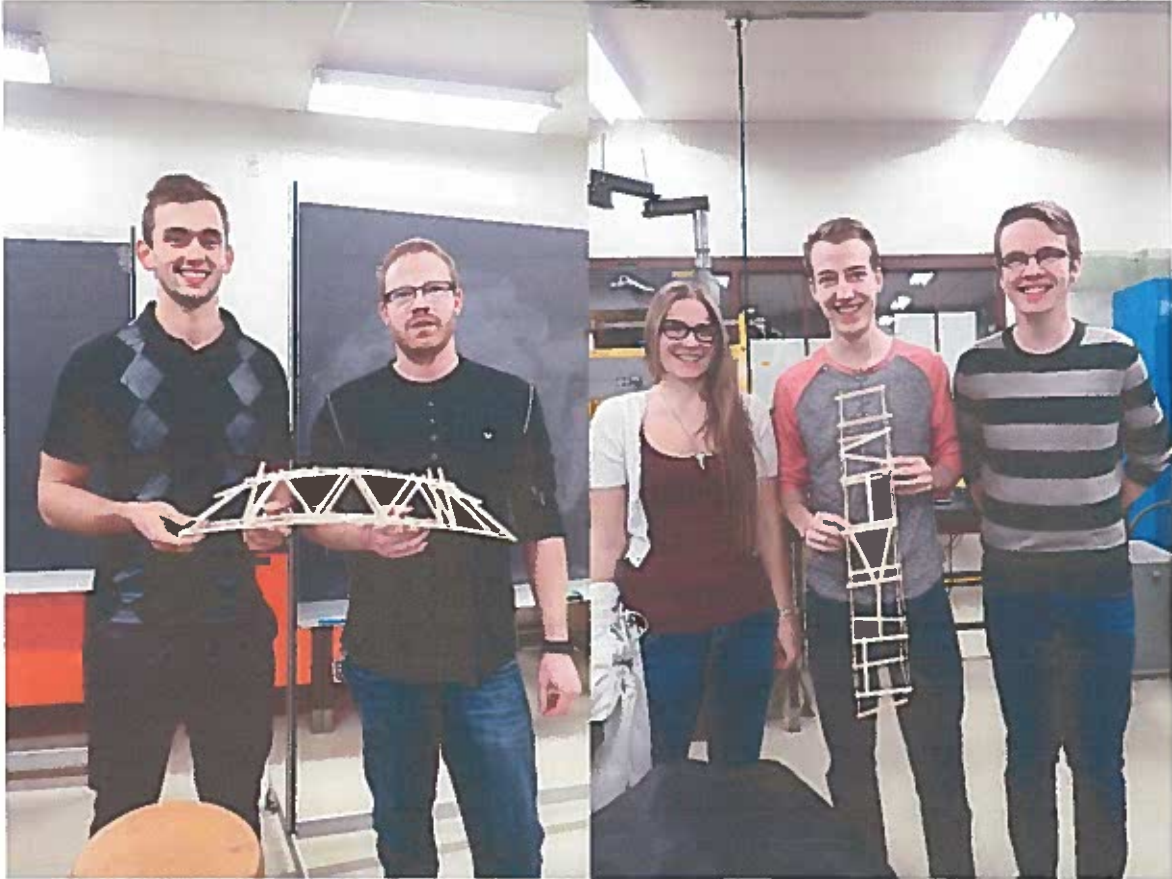
Activity Assessment:


